











## Mildred J. Snider Scholarship Fund

The Mildred J. Snider Scholarship Fund was created in memory of a former faculty member who was active in advocacy and policy change. It makes possible an award to be given annually for a social work graduate student who demonstrates a strong potential for advancement of social policies related to community development and social service integration. The recipient will engage in policy studies that involve the systematic analysis of the mix of government and non-government policy and program development in social welfare at federal, state, and local levels. Graduating this year is recipient **Kylie Spies**. The **Graduate Diversity Scholarship** is an initiative through the University of Iowa Graduate College to aid in building and sustaining an inclusive graduate community at the University of Iowa, which is essential to enhancing the quality of the intellectual environment for all of our students and faculty. Students who are underrepresented in their field of study apply and are reviewed for previous academic success and potential contributions. Selected recipients receive tuition scholarships for up to two semesters. Students who have earned this honor are noted in the program.

The School of Social Work is honored by several alumni and friends who have made donations to the School to assist students financially and give faculty an opportunity to acknowledge these students' accomplishments.

Janice Baumback Scholarship Award: Janice Baumback earned her MSW degree in 1971 from the School of Social Work and was a social worker for UI Psychiatric Hospital from 1971 until her retirement in 1986. This award is given to a second-year graduate student in the School of Social Work studying family counseling or mental health. Graduating this year is the 2020 recipient Laura Cain-Schreiner.

**Cathy Houlihan Scholarship**: Cathy Houlihan, a 1978 BA Social Work graduate, established this fund to support first-generation college students in the undergraduate social work program. The 2020 recipients who are graduating this year are **Cierra McArtor** and **Kaylee Parris**. 4

John Craft Excellence in Research Award: This award honors the memory of John Craft, former Professor of Research at the School of Social Work. Professor Craft was the author of a book on social work research methods and statistics that is used internationally, and he was published widely in the area of child welfare and protective services. John's widow, Professor Martha Craft-Rosenberg, maintains the award fund, which also receives donations from alumni. 2020 recipient **Amber Alaniz** graduates this year.

### Dianne Orton-Howard & Stephen Grant Orton Scholarship

**Fund**: Stephen Grant Orton graduated from the University of Iowa in 1970 with a BA in Science Education. He had extreme allergies and asthma and died from an allergic reaction in 1973. His sister Dianne established this award in his memory. It is given to a second-year MSW student who shows interest in medical social work. Graduating this year is 2020 recipient **Rachel Slezak**.

Lola Moeller Zook & Leslie G. Moeller Community Service Award: This fund provides annual scholarship support for a graduate student in Social Work who is studying, is active in, or intends to pursue employment in the field of community service. Preference is given to a student actively involved in community service. Graduating this year is recipient Amber Alaniz.

**Stephen and Lynnette Anfinson Scholarship**: Stephen Anfinson established a scholarship fund in memory of his wife, Lynette. This scholarship is to support an undergraduate social work student who exemplifies academic success, aptitude for and commitment to the profession as demonstrated in volunteer or work histories, and Iowa residency. Graduating this year is the 2020 recipient **Malaika Kigen**. Jean H. Winter and Robin Odem Winter Award: Robin Winter Odem established this scholarship fund in memory of her mother, Jean H. Winter, to support an undergraduate social work student who is a resident of Iowa. The award is made in the student's junior year and received in the fall of their senior year, to recognize academic excellence and aptitude for and commitment to the profession, as demonstrated in the student's volunteer and/or work histories. Graduating this year is recipient **Taylor Grider**.

Megan Sloss Memorial Scholarship: Megan Sloss was a second-year MSW student at the University of Iowa when she died suddenly on September 18th, 2016. Megan is remembered for her kindness to all individuals, her passion for working with children and those affected by mental illness, and for her strong faith. Megan's family was one of the most important things to her, and she was always using anecdotes from her small-town community to provide insight into different social work topics. To honor Megan, a scholarship has been created in her name, to pass on her legacy to aspiring social workers. Graduating this year is the 2020 recipient **Cindy Huerta**.
