Part II - Research Question

What is one research question you might pursue in your PhD program? How did you arrive at this research question? Why is it an important question? Which faculty in Social Work would you like to work with to help you develop your thinking, substantive knowledge, and methodological skills in order to address this question and why did you select them? Our program features a Concentration in another discipline (Psychology, Sociology, Education, Public Health), which do you think would be related to your research question and why. (2 pages)

Optional (1-page): Provide additional information useful to the admissions committee, such as explaining inconsistencies in your academic record or strengths, abilities or accomplishments not addressed in your essay or in your CV.
